PERSONAL STATEMENT

Zalman On Unreich (September 21, 1912 - April 21, 1978) was born in Bratislava, Czechoslovakia and immigrated to Palestine, Israel in the 1930s. He was a nameless hero by recorded history, and his whereabouts were often unknown, until now. Remarkably, Zalman was best known as an exceptional athlete, as a champion medalist in freestyle and Greco Roman wrestling, but he was so much more: a fierce protector of the Jewish community, an immigrant, founder of a youth Zionist movement and a member of Israeli intelligence organizations, a diplomat, Statesmen, rescuer of Jews and more. Zalman contributed in many ways during two historical periods: the pre-State Jewish community in Palestine and post-State of Israel in and after 1948.



SPORTS EXPERIENCE

BRATISLAVA, Slovakia (1920s) Accomplishments

- Participated in the Bratislava Maccabi Youth Club and medalist in wrestling.
- Became the Slovak welterweight champion in wrestling, 1927.
- Defeated the Austrian, Slovak and Hungarian middleweight to win the regional championship, 1928. His greatest achievement, the one he was most proud of in his early career was when he reached the final of the European Greco - Roman wrestling championships. In just two and a half minutes he defeated the reigning title holder, a Hungarian named Hegedus, who had already won the crown eleven times. Zalman was now European champion.

PALESTINE / ISRAEL (1930s – 1970s) Accomplishments

- Participated in the Maccabi Games, won first place in the heavyweight division in the Greco-Roman wrestling, 1935.
- Joined and eventually responsible for leading and managing the Hapoel sports clubs in Tel Aviv, 1930s. Devoted much of his energy to teaching the fundamentals of wrestling and training youth in the art of self-defense and fighting skills.
- Participated and fought in a tournaments organized by the Benny Leonard Sports Club at the Gan Rina open air cinema in the center of Tel Aviv. At the timed billed as an international amateur wrestling tournament between the Palestinian and Egyptian. All while, co-headlined multiple wrestling and boxing matches and getting star recognition in Israel sports newspaper publications.

Joined an official part of the Palestine Police Force, 1937.

In charge of security in the Eastern European embassy, 1948-1953.

BEN GURION INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

Worked for the Independent Tourism Agency, welcoming foreign dignitaries and diplomats, 1960s - 1970s.
